## SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS

*All items, in this COVID-19 statement, are subject to change and limitations may be imposed due to COVID-19 rules that may be in effect at the time of the event.*

*REVISED 06/30/2021 COVID-19 Notice to Participants:*

*Ultimately, it is your responsibility to assess the risk to you, both on-track and off, and to make the decision on whether or not to participate. If you are feeling unwell or are experiencing symptoms such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath please stay home. If you have been in contact with someone who has been experiencing these symptoms in the last two weeks, please stay home. While on site please take the health and safety of your fellow participants into consideration. Please plan on carrying a mask with you at all times should you be asked to put on a mask. In light of the current COVID-19 situation, the following guidelines will be in effect.*

*If you become sick during the event, see the medical staff and/or leave the facility immediately.*

*All participants exhibiting symptoms, including those who are fully vaccinated, shall be required to wear a face covering while in the Medical Building.*

*All participants, including those who are fully vaccinated, are encouraged to follow safe practices where appropriate and are encouraged to wear masks when social distancing is difficult to maintain.*

*Drivers should have all documentation and gear in order, with logbook filled out, prior to coming to tech for tech sticker. If you are diagnosed with COVID-19 within two (2) weeks of attending an SCCA event, we ask that you notify the event Registrar immediately*

*Parking/paddock staff may instruct you a particular direction that your tow vehicle and trailer must be parked in your space, to enhance distancing. If you are not parked in the correct space, and/or the wrong direction, you will need to correct your parking. This must be followed, and is not subject to protest.*

*Failure to comply with the COVID-19 regulations may result in removal from the event without a refund, even if the competition vehicle has not turned a wheel on the race track. This is not subject to protest.*

*If you are diagnosed with COVID-19 within two (2) weeks of attending an SCCA event, we ask that you notify the event Registrar immediately.*

This event is governed by the 2021 General Competition Rules (GCR) and Category Specifications, as amended for 2021 per "FasTrack", except as modified by these Supplemental Regulations.

**DRIVER ELIGIBILITY:** The Fall Sprints Double Divisional is open to all SCCA Novice Permit holders who have satisfied the school requirements, to current holders of SCCA Full Competition licenses, and to SCCA members who hold other recognized licenses, per GCR Appendix C.2.8.B and current Fastrack. If you do not have the proper license or if you are unsure, it is your responsibility to contact the Chief Registrar prior to the event.

**CAR ELIGIBILITY:** Competition is open to all cars conforming to the GCR, as amended, or those regional class cars per CENDIV Rules. Each car in each class is required during each of its on-track sessions to have a properly mounted and functioning AMB TRANX 260 or MyLaps X2 car transponder. Transponder times are the official times for all competition vehicles. The driver is responsible for providing correct information to Timing and Scoring (T&S). Please submit all corrections to name, sponsor info, and so on for grids and results within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the qualifying for your group to T&S. All cars are required to display CENDIV series stickers visibly placed on each side of the vehicle to be eligible for the CENDIV Divisional Championship Series presented by TRO Manufacturing. Stickers are provided free of charge and are available at tech.



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**REGISTRATION:** Drivers registering using credit cards may register online at <http://msreg.com/FallSprints2021>. Credit Card payments are deferred and will not be processed before the event weekend. All entries must be completed in their entirety. Please note that once you have entered all your personal and car data, it is archived and you will not have to re-enter it for subsequent races. Drivers without internet access may request a paper entry form and mail it with their entry fees to the Chief Registrar. Make checks payable to **Chicago Region, SCCA**. A fee of \$50 will be charged for any check returned by the bank, or refused credit card charges, and the entry will also be considered a late entry. Do not mail entries by any method that requires a signature for delivery. Phone / fax entries will not be accepted.

Entries are not official until the entry form is signed/submitted online (electronic signature accepted), received, paid, and accepted. We are not responsible for entries lost, delayed in transit, or failed emails. Email entries without a valid credit card number will not be processed. Late fees may be applied in these cases. Personal checks, cash, cashier's checks, and Visa/MasterCard entered online will be accepted for at-track registration.

**REFUNDS:** If you signed-in at registration you are eligible to receive a full refund if you withdraw before your racecar touches the track **AND** if you notify the Chief of Registration **BEFORE YOU LEAVE THE TRACK**. If you pre-enter and do not cancel your entry thru [motorsportsreg.com](http://motorsportsreg.com) or by notifying the Chief Registrar by October 10, 2021, you will be charged a \$50 cancellation fee.

**PASSES:** Each entry receives credentials for the driver plus up to three crew members. An Entrant at the event who is not the driver and is not on any Prep Shop list must be listed as a crew member. Additional passes (over crew) may be purchased at registration for \$10 each. Minors 12 years and younger will be issued guest passes at no charge. All crew members signing in under a prep shop list must be an SCCA member and are allowed one guest. Weekend memberships are available for purchase if needed. Non-participant SCCA members must present a valid membership card for admission; there may be a charge. Workers must present a current license and membership card at registration. Volunteer workers, guests, and crew must sign for their own passes and must arrive during posted registration hours.



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**TEST AND TUNE DAY:** Blackhawk Farms Raceway is holding a Test & Tune Day for Racecars on the Friday prior to the SCCA Double Divisional Weekend. Registration will be open from 4:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 7, 2021 and will reopen at 7:00 a.m. on Friday, October 8, 2021. You must be registered for the test day in order to gain access to the track. All crew members must be listed on your entry. This event is open only to drivers who hold a current competition license. If you are younger than 18 years of age, you must have approval from the track in advance to participate.

**CAR NUMBERS:** Every effort will be made to honor 2021 CENDIV reserved numbers through noon on September 24, 2021. Due to the make-up of run groups, however, this may not be possible in all situations. If two drivers holding the same reserved number request that number for the same run group, the number will be assigned to the driver with the earliest request. At noon on September 24, 2021, all unused reserved numbers will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. All three-digit car numbers must start with 1, i.e.: 1XX. Drivers sharing a car or running the same car in multiple classes, within a single race group for the weekend, must have a unique number per entry.

**TECH:** Tech will be located in the Tech building near the tower. A driver with a valid 2021 helmet sticker and a current Annual Inspection with no logbook entries, must present their logbook, completed tech card (provided to the driver or entrant during Registration check-in), and their helmet with the 2021 helmet sticker affixed to receive their event tech sticker. A driver who has not been issued a 2021 helmet sticker must present all driver gear (as listed in the GCR), with the vehicle logbook, and the completed tech card at tech. Any car requiring an Annual Inspection must be presented at Tech. Please allow sufficient time to have your car inspected.

**SCALES:** Scales are located at the Tech building. Tech scale hours are 7:30 AM-12:00 PM for both Saturday and Sunday. Scales may be available for other participants during race impound, but priority will be given to impounded cars. Scales may be made available at other times at the discretion of the Chief of Tech.

**SPLIT STARTS:** Split starts from any group that does not have one indicated in the schedule, are at the discretion of the Chief Steward who must receive a request within 30 minutes after posting of the final grid.

**RACE LENGTH:** Races on **Saturday and Sunday will be 24 laps** unless declared a timed race by the Chief Steward.

**TIMED SESSIONS:** Depending upon the circumstances, the Chief Steward may direct the clock to continue to run during a black flag ALL in a timed session.

**VICTORY LAPS:** When possible, victory laps will be permitted and are encouraged. The winner of each class should proceed immediately to pit out where he will receive a checkered flag and be directed on course for a single Victory Lap. Drivers need not wear a helmet or gloves during the victory lap and passengers are permitted in accordance with GCR 6.11.7. Drivers shall maintain a safe speed and be wary of any safety vehicles on course.

**START/FINISH:** The race will begin and end at the stripe in front of Timing and Scoring.

**EVENT SCHEDULE/RUN GROUPS:** See official schedule for race grouping and session lengths. On track hours will be per schedule and/or adjusted as needed for race operations. If changes are made prior to the start of the event, as much notice as possible will be given to all affected competitors. The schedule as published is for planning purposes only. Actual session start times may deviate from the published schedule based on event circumstances. Please listen to the PA system or tune to 88.7 FM and pay attention to what is happening on track. Start times indicated in the schedule are when cars are scheduled to be released from grid onto the track.

**TIMING AND SCORING:** If the Chief Steward allows the substitution of a car or driver, per GCR 5.12.3.A.6, any qualifying times earned for the original car/driver up to that point will be removed.

**LAST LAP INDICATOR:** When possible, a "1 to Go" sign and/or waving white flag will be displayed at start / finish to indicate the last lap has begun. An electronic display board may be used at the starter stand. Failure to display a last-lap indicator is not protestable.

**BLACK FLAG:** Vehicles which are leaking/spilling fluids, including fuel, may be black flagged from any session.



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**GRID:** If qualifying is not run for a group for any reason, the Chief Steward shall determine the method of setting the grid for the race. The fastest qualifier in a race group who selects the “outside pole” (per GCR) must notify the Grid Marshal at the front of the field **before** the five-minute warning is given to that race group. Cars arriving at the grid after their group has been dispatched on track may, at the discretion of the Operating Steward, be held at pit out and released at the end of the pack after the field has completed the pace lap.

**RADIO FREQUENCIES:** The following radio frequencies are reserved for race operations and may not be used by any competitors. These frequencies may be monitored but shall not be used for communication by any participant. Race Officials reserve the right to designate other frequencies for race administration.

**NOISE POLLUTION/SOUND CONTROL:** The maximum sound reading allowed by local ordinance is 102dB. During qualifying, if your car has a sound reading in excess of 102dB three or more times, you will be black flagged, and lose qualifying times for that session. You may attempt repairs and re-enter, but times prior to the black flag are lost. During the race, if your car has a sound reading in excess of 102dB three or more times, you may be black flagged, and moved to last finishing position with a loss of event points. When possible, during any on-track session, in the event that your car is measured above the maximum, you may be shown a furred black flag and SOUND board with your car number. This is to advise you that your car has exceeded the limit and is not a penalty – rather, an advisory to provide an opportunity for you to address the issue. For your information, sound readings will be posted inside the pavilion.

**PACE/SAFETY CAR:** In addition to GCR 6.6.2., the field shall follow the PACE/SAFETY car as long as its emergency lights are flashing, even if it varies from the normal race course. In the event a full course yellow results in dispatch of the safety car, the safety car will enter the racing surface at pit out.

**DISABLED CARS:** Disabled or damaged cars may be removed from the course and delivered to a central location. If the car sustained body/chassis damage, it will be released to the driver/crew after tech has made appropriate notations in the vehicle log book. Cars disabled due to a mechanical failure will be released to the driver/crew immediately. If the car requires wrecker support to return to its paddock location, there may be a delay depending upon the availability of wreckers or flat tows.

**PADDOCK/PARKING:** The main access road must remain open for emergency vehicles and two-way traffic. The apron along the main access road is available to racers to use at their discretion as long as they are considerate of fellow competitors and behind the line. Trailers and campsites, including motorhomes and lawn chairs, must be completely on the grass. Failure to follow the direction of the Paddock Marshal or their designate regarding paddock parking or activities may result in expulsion from the facilities.

**CLOTHING:** Proper credentials, closed toes shoes, and shirts with sleeves are required in the pit lane, false grid and on the grid.

**PIT LANE:** Cars entering the track from the pits must remain to the right of the blend line until the end of that line at turn one. As the pit lane is narrow, please stop as far to the right as possible for the safety of crew and pit lane personnel. All competitors must maintain a slow, prudent speed on pit lane at all times. Use the transit lane until reaching and upon exiting your pit stall. Do not drive through other pit stalls. Tire scrubbing is not permitted in the pit lanes and is permitted on track only after the apex of corner one.

Four crew members (plus the driver) are allowed in the pit lane to service a vehicle, and only 2 crew members are allowed by the wall that separates the pit lane from the track for signaling purposes. No crew members are allowed at the pit wall during starts and restarts.

Please do not put any equipment in pit lane, including at the pit wall, +/- 10 feet of start / finish, as this may interfere with timing and scoring electronics.

**RESULTS:** Live timing will be available during the event. Unless otherwise announced, live timing will be available via the Race Monitor App and Race Hero app, both have apps for iPhone and Android phones.



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Qualifying, provisional and final results will be posted at Driver Information Center (in the pavilion). Results will also be available online during the event at [bit.ly/cendivresults](http://bit.ly/cendivresults). Results will be posted on the CENDIV website ([www.scca-cendiv.org](http://www.scca-cendiv.org)) as soon as possible after the conclusion of the event.

**AWARDS:** Trophies for all races will be awarded according to the GCR. Trophies must be picked up at the pavilion after the race results become official and **no later than one hour after the conclusion of the event**. No trophies will be mailed. 2022 CENDIV Divisional Championship Series points will be awarded per CENDIV rules.

**WELCOMING ENVIRONMENT:** The Central Division SCCA and its regions aims to provide an inclusive, welcoming environment for all participants. Further, we fully support and endorse the National SCCA Welcoming environment policies. To that end, behaviors such as the following will be considered egregious examples of GCR 2.1.7, "Acting in an unsportsmanlike manner", and will be penalized as such:

1. Discriminating against, disparaging or verbally abusing a participant because of their gender identity, ethnicity, marital status, sexual orientation, religion, age or disability;
2. Harassing, intimidating, threatening or bullying any participant;
3. Doing any of the above outside the confines of the event, or in print or electronic media, in a way that affects that person's participation at the event.

### GENERAL RULES:

A competitor involved in contact, or who has violated flag rules (yellow, black, red, or checker), must report directly to impound in the racecar, and report to the steward. All on-track contact (including contact during drafting) that causes a car to act erratically and results in a change of position or a car leaving the course will be investigated.

Drivers may be held responsible for harm to property, including damage to the track and to the environment. Fees charged for the removal / disposal of hazardous waste or used tires will be assessed to the responsible driver.

### Blackhawk Farms Raceway Rules:

- a. **NOISE POLLUTION REGULATION:** No race car or engine, including showroom cars with open exhaust, shall be run before 8:00 a.m. or after 6:00 p.m. on any weekend day or not before 9:00 a.m. or after 4:30 p.m. on weekdays (Monday through Friday).
- b. **WRISTBAND REQUIREMENT:** A wristband indicating you have registered for the event must be presented to the Guard to allow your entry onto the property of Blackhawk Farms Raceway.
- c. All minors must be under direct parental or acting guardian supervision at all times.
- d. Drivers/Riders are responsible for the conduct of their crews and guests.
- e. **ALL PET ANIMALS MUST BE LEASHED OR CONFINED AND CLEANED UP AFTER.**
- f. No two or three wheeled vehicles are allowed except for race officials' use or as race support vehicles. Only licensed drivers 16 years and older may operate race support vehicles or golf carts.
- g. Our Concession Stand will be available for most events. Gas, oil, water, and air are available. Souvenirs and other consumables are available for purchase in the Pit Stop.
- h. **ALL TRASH MUST be placed in receptacles provided. Environmentally hazardous waste MUST be disposed of in appropriate receptacles. All used tires MUST be removed or the organization will be charged for their disposal.**
- i. All drivers and members will be responsible for notifying crews and guests concerning the hours of registration. A closing time will be included on the entry form.
- j. Electric power is available. Tags for the outlets will be issued at time of purchase from Security or in the Pit Stop.
- k. All drivers, members, officials and spectators must comply with the Pit Vehicle Policy of BFR including the purchase and display of a Pit Vehicle Pass for each unit present on the Premises.
- l. The use of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS), better known as drones, is prohibited.

**All competitors must vacate the premises by 7:00 PM Sunday.**
